LEARNER COACHES

Your welfare is our top priority, so when you enrol, you'll be allocated a Learner Coach. These staff will help you in areas such as attendance, achievement and progression.

Learner Coaches provide a programme of individual coaching, which means they'll get to know your needs and in turn be able to help you throughout your time with us. Learner Coaches provide a support system for each student, which is great for your personal development and helping you overcome any barriers to learning.

FINANCIAL SUPPORT -BURSARY

Many students need some financial help while studying and here at East Riding College there are options to support you, depending on your personal circumstances.

This support might be able to help with course costs for supplies, travel, meals at College, childcare and other study-related expenses. There is increased financial support for young people who are from vulnerable groups, specifically those in care, care leavers and young people in receipt of income support or universal credit, subject to eligibility. There is also support for those in receipt of both Disability Living Allowance or Personal Independence Payments, in their own right as well as Employment and Support Allowance or Universal Credit in their own right.

SAFEGUARDING

To look after all the students and staff here at ERC there is the Safeguarding and Emotional Wellbeing Team, who are available to talk to if you have any concerns, are unhappy, or even worried about the welfare of a friend or a fellow student.

The team are here to chat things through and are very easy to approach. You can talk to one of them about problems you might be having, which might include being bullied, abuse, self-harm, accommodation issues, caring responsibilities, and anything else that you may be concerned about.

WHAT ARE T LEVELS?

T Levels are qualifications designed to give you a head start towards the future you want.

They follow GCSEs and are equivalent to three A Levels. The two-year qualification brings classroom and work placement together, on a course designed in collaboration with the best employers.

You'll spend 80% of your time in the classroom and 20% on a 45-day placement to equip you with the knowledge and skills companies are looking for. Your T Level will help you to step straight into your chosen career, an apprenticeship or a degree. Wherever your future is heading, take it to the next level.

We are proud to offer T Levels as a choice, they are available in:

- Building services engineering for construction (Electrotechnical **Engineering**)
- **Digital Production Design Development (Computer Science)**
- Machining & Toolmaking
- Onsite Construction Bricklaying
- Onsite Construction -**Carpentry & Joinery**
- Education & Childcare

TLEVEL BUILDING SERVICES ENGINEERING FOR CONSTRUCTION (ELECTROTECHNICAL ENGINEERING)

The qualification will help you gain an understanding of the BSE industry and the sector.

You will cover topics such as: Health and Safety, construction science principles, sustainability in the construction industry and building services engineering systems.

WHAT WILL I LEARN?

- · Electrotechnical engineering
- · Electrical and electronic equipment engineering
- · Protection systems engineering
- · Gas engineering.

WORK EXPERIENCE

A work placement with a duration of 315 hours (minimum) is needed as this forms part of your course and support you in the 'employer set project' element of the course. This is scheduled for the second year of the course.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES:

This qualification focuses on the development of knowledge and skills needed for working in the BSE industry, which will prepare you to enter the industry through employment or as an Apprentice. Furthermore, the completion of this qualification gives the student the opportunity to progress onto higher education courses and training.

The structure of the qualification is designed to give you the breadth of knowledge and understanding across the BSE industry but also equips you with necessary occupational and core skills to enter the industry. This qualification is designed to support fair access and allows you to manage and improve your own performance.

T LEVEL DIGITAL PRODUCTION, DESIGN & DEVELOPMENT

During the two-year programme, students will learn the core knowledge that underpins each industry.

They will also develop occupationally specific skills that will allow them to enter skilled employment within a specific occupation.

There will be opportunities for industrial trips and visits and a number of quest speakers will be invited in to contextualise your learning.

The purpose of the T Level technical qualification in Digital Production, Design and Development is to ensure students have the knowledge and skills needed to progress into highly skilled employment, an Apprenticeship or higher level study, including university, within the specialist area of software design and development.

WHAT WILL I LEARN?

The course is predominantly taught face-to-face and students will learn about the following topics:

- Problem solving
- Programming
- · Emerging issues and impact of digital
- · IT-related legislation
- · Business context
- Data
- · Digital environments (networking and PC builds)
- · Cyber security
- · Testina.

WORK EXPERIENCE

Industry placement: of at least 315 hours (approximately 45 days) with an employer to make sure you have authentic experience of the workplace.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES:

The digital industry is a major source of employment in the UK, with 1.46 million people working in digital companies and around 45,000 digital iobs advertised at any one time.

Digital skills span all industries; almost all jobs in the UK today require employees to have a proficient level of digital literacy. The UK has positioned itself to be the 'digital capital of Europe' as it continues to invest billions every year in digital skills and commerce.

UNIVERSITY & FURTHER STUDIES:

Foundation degree/BA degree in Computing technologies.

TLEVEL EDUCATION & EARLY YEARS

T-LEVELS

The T level in Education and Early Years is a twoyear program which aims to prepare students to gain the knowledge, skills and practical experience necessary to work with young children either in nursery settings, primary school or in various other careers in the sector.

To study on a T level programme. you need to achieve a minimum of four GCSEs at grades 4-9 which must include maths and English language.

WHAT WILL I LEARN?

In the first year, you will study the 12 core elements which include:

- · Child development
- · Working in partnership
- · Equality, diversity and inclusive practice
- · Reflective practice
- · Special educational needs
- · Safeguarding and well-being.

In the second year the emphasis will be on the occupational specialism to gain your Early Years Educator which is the industry standard licence to practice at Level 3.

WORK EXPERIENCE

Students will undertake a minimum of 750 hours practical work placement experience over the duration of the course. This can be in a variety of early years settings and with children between the ages of 0 to 7 years.

UNIVERSITY & FURTHER STUDIES:

The T Level in Education and Early Years carries UCAS points which will allow you to study at a higher education level for a career as a primary school teacher, child psychologist, children's play worker or to further your career working in

T LEVEL ONSITE CONSTRUCTION BRICKLAYING

This course has been designed to deliver a high level of knowledge about the onsite industry as well as the occupational skills required to enter the industry.

The qualification will help you gain an understanding of the onsite industry and the sector, and you will cover topics such as health and safety, construction science principles and sustainability in the construction industry

WHAT WILL I LEARN?

· Bricklaying and construction principles.

T LEVEL ENGINEERING, MANUFACTURING, PROCESS & CONTROL - MACHINING & TOOLMAKING TECHNOLOGIES!

The T Level technical qualification in Engineering, Manufacturing. Processing and Control allows students to gain an understanding of what is needed to work within the engineering industry

Topics covered include processes of production and manufacturing, materials, specialist machinery, product and project management and quality assurance and quality control.

WHAT WILL I LEARN?

- · Processes of production and manufacturing
- · Materials used in production, manufacturing, and fabrication
- Environments
- · Specialist machinery utilised in the production and manufacturing environments
- · Product and project management
- · Quality assurance and quality

WORK EXPERIENCE

A work placement with a duration of 315 hours (minimum) is needed as this forms part of your course and support you in the 'employer set project' element of the course. This is scheduled for the second year of the course

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES:

This technical qualification focuses on the development of knowledge and skills needed for working in the Engineering industry, which will prepare you to enter the industry through employment or as an apprentice. Furthermore, the completion of this qualification gives you the opportunity to progress onto higher education courses and training.

The structure of the qualification is designed to give you the breadth of knowledge and understanding across the Engineering. Manufacturing, Process & Control industry but also equips you with necessary occupational and core skills to enter the industry. This qualification is designed to support fair access and allows you to manage and improve your own performance.

T LEVEL ONSITE CONSTRUCTION CARPENTRY & JOINERY

This course has been designed to deliver a high level of knowledge about the onsite industry as well as the occupational skills required to enter the industry.

The qualification will help you gain an understanding of the onsite industry and the sector, and you will cover topics such as health and safety, construction science principles and sustainability in the construction industry.

WHAT WILL I LEARN?

Carpentry and Joinery and construction principles.

WORK EXPERIENCE

A work placement with a duration of 315 hours (minimum) is needed as this forms part of your course and support you in the 'employer set project' element of the course. This is scheduled for the second year of the course.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES:

This technical qualification focuses on the development of knowledge and skills needed for working in the onsite industry, which will prepare you to enter the industry through employment or as an apprentice. Furthermore, the completion of this qualification gives you the opportunity to progress to higher education courses and training.

The structure of the qualification is designed to give you the breadth of knowledge and understanding across the onsite industry but also equips you with necessary occupational and core skills to enter the industry. This qualification is designed to support fair access and allows you to manage and improve your own performance.



INTRODUCTORY BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION

The qualification is not designed to lead directly to employment but will maximise opportunities for students to progress by focusing on the development of transferable and sector-related skills around Business Administration.

LEVEL	COURSE	DURATION
Level 1	Introductory to Business Administration	One year

WHAT WILL I STUDY?

You will be expected to complete all core units such as:

Being organised

- Developing a personal progression plan
- Working with others and researching a topic

Alongside these core units, six sector units will need completing. Examples of these units include:

- Finding out about businesses in your area
- · Branding a product
- Creating a visual display
- · Communicating with customers.

All units provide students will the opportunity to develop the skills needed for future study and eventually employment.

SITE/CAMPUS:

HOW WILL I BE ASSESSED?

As a Level 1 qualification the pass standard requires you to complete routine, simple and directed tasks by applying your knowledge and skills. It is expected that you complete tasks fully under supervision, direction or with guidance. At merit and distinction levels, you may be expected to complete tasks in greater detail or with greater confidence or independence.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:

- A satisfactory College interview
- · Suitable references
- Appropriate level of English and mathematics.

PERFORMING ARTS

The Performing Arts course is ideal if you want to explore your talents in acting, dance and gain some experience in performing arts.

You will gain confidence in people and life skills as well as developing creative thinking. Many skills developed on the course such as communication, teamwork and creativity are transferable to other area of life.

LEVEL	COURSE	DURATION
Entry Level 3	Performing Arts	One year
Level 1	Performing Arts	One year

WHAT WILL I STUDY?

You will learn basic performance skills and techniques to allow you to create a character and perform in front of an audience. You will have lots of opportunities to develop your personal learning, design and thinking skills.

HOW WILL I BE ASSESSED?

The course is completed via a range of practical based assessments as a portfolio of evidence.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:

- · A satisfactory College interview
- · Suitable references
- Appropriate level of English and mathematics.

FOUNDATION

SKILLS FOR WORKING LIFE

The purpose of this City & Guilds qualification is to provide an opportunity for students to develop a wide range of personal, social and work-related skills that will enable them to become more independent and gain appropriate work-related skills and/or work experience.

LEVEL	COURSE	DURATION
Entry Levels 2 & 3	Skills for Working Life	One year

WHAT WILL I STUDY?

Core units - these are mandatory and include:

- Dealing with problems in daily life
- Working as part of a group
- Individual rights and responsibilities
- Healthy living
- Managing your own money
- Preparation for work.

You may be able to choose from a range of vocational areas, including:

- Brickwork
- · Catering and hospitality
- Horticulture
- · Information technology
- Joinery
- Metalwork
- · Motor vehicle.

You will also study/complete:

- · English and mathematics
- Work experience (as appropriate)
- · Enterprise activity.

There will be a mixture of classroom and external contact

SITE/CAMPUS:

Beverley

HOW WILL I BE ASSESSED?

Student work will be assessed and verified throughout the year.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:

- · A satisfactory College interview
- · Suitable references
- Appropriate level of English and mathematics.

LIFE SKILLS

This newly developed course is specifically for students to develop independent living, independent travel and community engagement.

It is expected that students have previously undertaken other qualifications prior to starting this course. This course offers the opportunity for a more personalised programme of study.

COURSE	DURATION
Life Skills	One year

WHAT WILL I STUDY?

- Independent travel training
- Independent living skills including basic catering
- Engagement with external community groups and organisations.

SITE/CAMPUS:

HOW WILL I BE ASSESSED?

Students will be assessed and verified throughout the year and goals set on their ILP.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:

- · A satisfactory College interview
- · Suitable references
- Appropriate level of English and mathematics.

INTRODUCTORY VOCATIONAL STUDIES

The Level 1 Diploma in Introductory Vocational Studies is designed to introduce students to a variety of areas of work and the employment opportunities within them.

Students are encouraged to try out a range of vocational areas, find out which they like best and gain a better sense of direction for their future careers.

Level 1	Introductory Vocational Studies	One year

WHAT WILL I STUDY?

Core units - these are mandatory and include:

- · Career progression
- Self-assessment.

You will choose from a range of vocational areas, including:

- · Art and performing arts
- · Caring for children
- Construction
- Engineering
- · IT and business
- Public services
- · Sports and active leisure
- Travel and tourism.

You will also study/complete:

- English and mathematics
- · Work experience.

SITE/CAMPUS:

Beverley

HOW WILL I BE ASSESSED?

Student work will be assessed and verified throughout the year.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:

- · A satisfactory College interview
- · Suitable references
- Appropriate level of English and mathematics.

WHAT NEXT?

The opportunity to progress (if appropriate) to a more vocationally specific course, employment or an Apprenticeship.

SUPPORTED INTERNSHIP

This course is for students with special educational needs (who have an EHC Plan) who want to progress into paid employment.

During your internship, you will spend a large amount of time with an employer, gaining work experience, with the aim of giving you a real insight into the world of work.

Supported Internship	One year

WHAT WILL I STUDY?

- Supported work experience
- Practical life skills
- Mathematics and English if appropriate.

HOW WILL I BE ASSESSED?

Portfolio

Photographic evidence Practical assessment.
