Applications for Provider Access Introduction

We are committed to ensuring our learners have access to impartial CEIAG and as such we welcome providers, as per our duty under Section 42B of the Education Act 1997 (2nd January 2018) to provide learners at all stages and years with access to providers of post-14, post-16 and post-18 education and training, appropriate to their age band.

Learners must be allowed:

- to find out more about technical education qualifications and apprenticeship opportunities, as part of a careers programme which informs learners of the full range of education and training options available to them at each transition point.
- to hear from a range of local providers about the opportunities on offer, e.g. technical education and apprenticeships this can be achieved through options evenings, assemblies, group discussions, and taster events.
- to understand how to apply to the full range of academic and technical courses available to them.

This document sets out the TEC Partnership's arrangements for managing the access of providers to its learners for the purpose of giving them information about the provider's education or training offer. This complies with the institution's legal obligations under Section 42B of the Education Act 1997.
